

## **Change to Prescribed Load List (PLL) Stockage Criteria for FORSCOM Units**

FORSCOM Message, AFLG-SMS, DTG 122035Z Mar 01, subject: Retail Supply Policy Changes, authorizes FORSCOM units to implement interim PLL policy changes as follows:

1. FORSCOM Major Subordinate Commands (MSC) may relax unit PLL stockage criteria to a minimum of six demands to add and three demands to retain. Following units are authorized to use an add/retain demand criteria of 3/1: U.S. Army National Guard (ARNG), U.S. Army Signal Command (USASC), U.S. Army Space Command (USARSPACE), U.S. Army Intelligence and Security Command (INSCOM), U.S. Army Air Traffic Control (USATC) units, U.S. Army Medical units (only those units with a medical equipment repairer required by MTOE), and U.S. Army Aviation Unit Maintenance (AVUM).
2. MSC's may also authorize units to use a 360-day control period in lieu of the currently authorized 180-day control period. This will allow smoothing of demands over a year and reduce add and delete turbulence.
3. Initial stockage of repair parts for newly introduced end items, as identified by support list allowance cards (SLAC's) is authorized for PLL stockage. These lines will not count against current non-demand supported and total PLL line limits until a demand-supported stockage determination is made within the maximum 2-year timeframe.
4. All other PLL stockage criteria and rules remain unchanged at this time.
