SUBJECT: Medical Assemblage Process

1. Purpose: To provide a summary of the medical assemblage process at the US Army Medical Materiel Agency Program Management Office, Medical Devices (PMO MD).

2. Facts:

a. Medical Sets, Kits, and Outfits (SKOs) are developed by the Directorate of Combat and Doctrine Development (DCDD) located at Ft. Sam Houston TX. DCDD derives the requirements for each set and each piece of associated support item of equipment (ASIOE) within those SKOs. PMO MD develops the solutions to fill those requirements and partners with the DCDD to review the SKOs every three years. PMO MD manages 109 Line Item Number (LIN) medical SKOs that include 8,621 individual National Stock Number (NSN) items; 207 of those NSNs are maintenance-significant equipment items; 92 of these maintenance-significant items have a LIN and are an ASIOE item. Each of the 109 SKOs has a unique bill of material (BOM).

b. PMO MD is responsible for the lifecycle management of all 8,621 items in the 109 BOMs. PMO MD is responsible to develop and obtain all medical LINs and NSNs for each item that goes into the SKOs; to manage the lifecycle and relationships of each NSN and LIN; to source each one of those items; participate on the SKO review board for each SKO; and to configure each maintenance significant item. PMO MD is responsible for the cradle-to-grave support of the equipment items replacing and or modernizing items as they are no longer procurable, maintainable, supportable, or if DCDD states that the requirements for an item has changed and a new materiel solution is needed. All of the data that PMO MD develops and manages drives manpower, documented requirements, procurement authorizations, procurement actions, fielding authorizations, disposition instructions, and modernizations.
