

MEDICAL, CHEMICAL, BIOLOGICAL,
RADIOLOGICAL, AND NUCLEAR
DEFENSE MATERIEL (MCDM)

USAMMA enhances readiness by fielding countermeasures used in the protection and treatment of Soldiers in the event of a chemical, biological, radiological, or nuclear attack. These countermeasures include: pretreatment, treatment, antidotes skin decontamination and Potency and Dated (P&D) items for the Medical Equipment Set, Chemical Agent Patient Treatment.

To ensure immediate availability, the MCDM is positioned at strategic locations worldwide and prepared for rapid shipment to deploying units. This materiel is issued to deploying or forward deployed forces in coordination with OTSG approval.

Unit Deployment Package (UDP)

The UDP program provides early deploying (Days 1-31), echelon above brigade (EAB), medical units with their basic load of medical P&D materiel. These EAB units are identified through the evaluation of Operational Plans and OTSG Guidance.

The UDP program is critical for the rapid support to contingency operations, stability and support operations, Homeland Security, and the Global War on Terrorism. Supported units include Hospitals, Dental, Veterinary, Preventive Medicine, Air and Ground Ambulance Companies, Forward Surgical Teams and other specialized EAB teams.

CENTRALIZED CONTINGENCY PROGRAMS

- Army Prepositioned Stocks (APS) Class VIII materiel
- Office of The Surgeon General (OTSG) Contingency Stocks:
 - ⇒ Reserve Component Hospital Decrement (RCHD)
 - ⇒ Medical Chemical, Biological, Radiological, and Nuclear Defense Materiel (MCDM)
 - ⇒ Unit Deployment Packages (UDP's) Potency and Dated (P&D) Items

ARMY PREPOSITIONED STOCKS (APS)

Prepositioned materiel is a critical element of the Army's ability to project forces worldwide. The USAMMA manages the Class VIII materiel in partnership with the Army Materiel Command (AMC) who manages all other classes of supply.

HODA owns and authorizes release of the APS. The materiel is prepositioned at multiple locations to optimize strategic lift: capability worldwide. The program consists of Brigade and Hospital Unit Sets, Operational Projects and Sustainment Stocks.

The USAMMA's proven ability to deliver APS Class VIII materiel is a critical part of the Army's Strategic Mobility Program.

OTSG CONTINGENCY STOCKS

The Office of the Surgeon General (OTSG) contingency stocks provide an essential capability to the warfighter by ensuring specific medical assets are available when needed most. Centrally managed medical contingency program materiel is owned and released by the OTSG.

The common goals of these centrally managed programs are to:

- Provide a balance between just-in-case and just-in-time delivery for rapid deployments;
- Minimize the investment to medical units by consolidating procurement, management, and shared requirements;
- Bridge the gap between deployments and adequate industrial base capabilities;
- Provide comprehensive life-cycle logistics management to complex systems.

RESERVE COMPONENT HOSPITAL DECREMENT (RCHD)

The RCHD program provides long-term care of supplies in storage for all hospitals in the U.S. Army Reserve. The program provides the decrement between MTOE required and authorized materiel. Upon deployment, the RCHD materiel brings the units from their peacetime authorized levels to Authorized Level of Organization-one (ALO-1).

The USAMMA manages the storage, sustainment, and maintenance of medical equipment, supplies, and non-medical Associated Support Items of Equipment (ASIOE) in the units. The materiel is stored at the Sierra Army Depot Herlong, CA

MEDICAL MATERIEL READINESS PROGRAM

The Medical Materiel Readiness Program (MMRP) is an enterprise wide supply chain opportunities aimed at optimizing medical materiel management processes. MMRP is the deliberate process to reduce unit owned equipment while increasing the unit leased concept through proven business processes with established centrally managed medical equipping programs. The MMRP program consists of four (4) 248 Bed Corps CSHs available to Army Role 3 unit with immediate capability that is built to the latest Unit Assemblage (UA) currently maintained at Sierra Army Depot Herlong, CA. The program was designed to ensure MMRP Combat Support Hospitals (CSHs) were maintained in a maximum state of readiness as part of the entire life cycle management process. The goal of MMRP is to improve efficiencies resulting in controlled costs and reduced logistics burden on units through the adoption and proliferation of best logistics / equipping business practices.
