COL Walsh received his commission into the Medical Service Corps after graduating from Eastern Kentucky University as an ROTC Distinguished Military Graduate in 1993. After completing both the AMEDD Officer Basic Course and Medical Logistics Course at Fort Sam Houston, Texas, he was assigned as the Battalion S4, 16th Medical Logistics Battalion, 18th Medical Command, Camp Carroll, Korea. COL Walsh then served in various leadership positions within the 1st Cavalry Division, Fort Hood, Texas, which included Treatment Platoon Leader and Company Executive Officer, C Co, 215th Forward Support Battalion, and later Division Medical Supply Officer, C Co, 27th Main Support Battalion.

COL Walsh then completed the Combined Logistics Officer Advanced Course at Fort Lee, Virginia, and the Combined Arms Service and Staff School at Fort Leavenworth, Kansas. He then served as the Force Medical Supply Officer, 1st U.S. Army Support Battalion, Multinational Force and Observers, Sinai, Egypt. He returned to 1st Cavalry Division, serving as the Commander, E Co, 27th Main Support Battalion followed by Battalion S3, 115th Forward Support Battalion. After completing the Medical Logistics Management Internship Program, COL Walsh served as the Chief, Medical Materiel Branch, Ireland Army Community Hospital, Fort Knox, Kentucky and was selected to attend Command and General Staff College, Fort Leavenworth, Kansas.

After finishing CGSC, COL Walsh served as the Senior Medical Logistics Planner, 4th Infantry Division which included a deployment in support of OIF 05-07 (Multinational Division-Baghdad). Following this assignment, COL Walsh served in various leadership assignments within the 1st Medical Brigade, Fort Hood, Texas, which included Brigade S4, Brigade Executive Officer, and culminated with service as the S9, Task Force 1st Medical Brigade in support of OIF 09-11 (TF1 MED, Baghdad). Following this deployment, COL Walsh served as the Secretary of the General Staff, 13th Sustainment Command (Expeditionary), Fort Hood, Texas. COL Walsh then served as Commander, 24th Brigade Support Battalion, 170th Infantry Brigade Combat Team, Baumholder, Germany (including OEF 11-12) followed by Commander, 16th Special Troops Battalion (Provisional), also in Baumholder, Germany. He was then assigned to USCENTCOM where he served as the Medical Logistics Planner in the J4. COL Walsh then served as a U.S. Army War College National Security Fellow, JFK School of Government, Harvard University. Prior to his arrival at USAMMA, COL Walsh served as the Commander of the U.S. Army Medical Materiel Center – Europe.

COL Walsh's awards and decorations include the Legion of Merit, Bronze Star Medal (2OLC), Defense Meritorious Service Medal (1OLC), Meritorious Service Medal (3OLC), Army Commendation Medal (4OLC), Army Achievement Medal (2OLC), National Defense Service Medal (Bronze Service Star), Afghanistan Campaign Medal (2 Campaign Stars), Iraq Campaign Medal (3 Campaign Stars), Global War on Terror Service Medal, Korean Defense Service Medal, Armed Forces Reserve Medal (Bronze Hourglass), Army Service Ribbon, Overseas Service Ribbon (Numeral 7), NATO Medal (ISAF), Multinational Force and Observers Medal (Numeral 2), Joint Meritorious Unit Award (1OLC), Meritorious Unit Commendation (2OLC), Army Superior Unit Award, Expert Field Medical Badge and the Army Parachutist Badge.

COL Walsh holds a Master of Arts in Procurement and Acquisition Management from Webster University, and is a member of the Order of Military Medical Merit.
